





VOTE-COPE

Everything points to a 2018 banner year. Contributions to VOTE-COPE, our Union's voluntary political action fund, are perhaps the greatest single defense in preserving our retirement security, as well as protecting, for our active members, tenure, bargaining rights, salaries and ensuring adequate funding for public schools, universities and health care systems in addition to protecting labor rights. Most recently, VOTE-COPE funds were used to help defeat the Constitutional Convention by a margin of 83% to 17% two years ago,

and this past fall these funds helped us get candidates from both sides of the aisle elected, who are supportive of education, health care and labor!

Much of this success can be attributed to RETIREE CONTRIBUTIONS. We asked, and retirees answered by increasing the dollar amount being contributed as well as the number of retirees increasing in contributing to VOTE-COPE.

It would be great if we could rest on our laurels, but given what we face on the Horizon-the radical Trump/ DeVos agenda for Public Education and worker rights we are in the battle of a lifetime. This legislative session NYSUT will be using VOTE-COPE funds to **FIGHT**: to fix APPR and the "Testing Insanity," for state I funding for schools, colleges and health care systems, against charter operators and vouchers, to save the SUNY hospitals.
